Thank you for being an essential part of this journey. Together, we are advancing impact—one community at a time.





# 63,195 Lives Transformed in 2024





6,500 individuals in Phoenix, Arizona, benefited from chronic disease prevention, nutrition education, oral health, wellness education, and improved access to healthy foods.



Across **Bolivia**, **47,825** people were connected with tools for education, food stability, and clean water.



Through international medical missions, 1,645 individuals in Mexico received life-changing dental care.



Community-based programs in Mozambique reached 1,350 individuals with education, nutrition, and agricultural resources.



Advance Community supported 4,680 individuals in Nicaragua through initiatives centered on water access, nutrition, and food security.



In **Peru**, **1,195** people gained access to critical support in education, agriculture, and housing through our global partnerships.

# The Impact of AVODEC

The Story of Luis Benicio Guido Zelaya

In the mountains of the Jinotega Department, in the community of Valerio, lives a 24-year-old young man named Luis Benicio Guido Zelaya. Single, with a younger sister, and living with his parents, Luis is a young man full of aspirations and dreams. He is currently in his second year of an Agricultural Engineering degree, an achievement that once seemed out of reach before he encountered AVODEC, a nonprofit organization transforming lives in rural communities like his.

AVODEC operates in five municipalities of Jinotega (Jinotega, La Concordia, El Cuá, Bocay, and Wiwilí). From potable water and sanitation systems to health and food security programs, their focus is on building a sustainable future for families and communities. For young people like Luis, AVODEC represents an opportunity to learn, grow, and thrive.

Luis vividly recalls how AVODEC supported him from the very beginning. In 2024, the organization provided him with financial aid to continue his university studies, significantly reducing his associated costs. This support marked a turning point in his life: he no longer viewed his education as an unattainable dream but as a path to a better future.

But AVODEC's impact didn't stop there. Luis became an agroecological promoter, leading a group of farmers in sustainable agricultural practices. He has learned to produce organic fertilizers, biofertilizers, and other natural inputs—skills that have not only transformed how he works the land but also reshaped his understanding of the importance of caring for the environment. Thanks to this knowledge, he is now able to promote healthy, high-quality production in his community.

One of Luis's dreams is to own his own land.

Through the loan fund that AVODEC offers to women and young people, he plans to purchase 50 acres of land to produce his own food. "I want to reduce my dependence on sharecropping, where the landowner benefits more than the person doing all the work," he explains. This step will be crucial to achieving his goal of economic independence and self-sufficiency.

Luis has not only gained technical knowledge but also confidence in himself and his ability to lead and undertake projects. He participates in forums, fairs, and self-evaluation processes, tools that have helped him grow as a community leader. He acknowledges that the involvement and support of his family have been fundamental along his journey.

Today, Luis is proud to be part of AVODEC and grateful for the opportunity to learn and grow with the organization. "Thanks to AVODEC, little by little I've gained knowledge and now lead a group of farmers who work agroecologically. My greatest wish is to keep learning, work my own land, and, within a year, share how much I managed to produce, what my income was, and how I paid off my land."

Luis's story is a testament to the impact AVODEC has on the lives of young people, women, and entire communities. Their work not only fosters environmental and economic sustainability but also hope and empowerment for those who need it most.


